INSTRUCTIONS:

Here's how it works!

Before the BOWL-A-THON:

Sign up as many sponsors as possible to pledge a certain amount of money per total pins for 3 games before the BOWL-A-THON. Be sure to tell sponsors approximately what your bowling average might be. OR you may collect outright donations.

IMPORTANT: You must raise a minimum of \$40.00 to bowl.

At the BOWL-A-THON:

Bring this completed sponsor form to the bowling alley.
Sign in.

BOWL - remember, this is not a race. Prizes are determined by the amount of money you collect, and by the total number of sponsors you obtain.

After bowling, DON'T LEAVE! Be sure your form is verified by your lane captain, and wait for secondary prizes to be awarded.

After the BOWL-A-THON

Katie was diagnosed at the age of six months with PNET (Primitive Neural Ecto Dermal Tumor), a cancerous golf-ball sized tumor located under her left shoulder. Katie underwent surgery and chemotherapy treatments, and then again, more surgery. Katie was doing well, and things were going great, until March 11, 2003 (almost four years from the day of the original diagnosis) when Katie was scheduled for a routine MRI. The test revealed that the tumor had not only returned, but now had "fingers" growing from it. Surgery and chemotherapy were again scheduled and now radiation. Unfortunately, shortly thereafter, Katie started experiencing severe headaches and it was discovered that, sadly enough, the cancer found its way not only into the meninges (the layer of tissue that surrounds the brain and the spinal cord), but also her spine. Radiation continued but found not to be successful, as a CAT scan showed the tumor didn't shrink but continued to grow and spread.

*On August 12, 2003, eleven days shy of her fifth birthday, Katie passed away. The primary goal of **Katie's Crusaders** is to promote pediatric cancer awareness, as well as assist families and children affected by cancer and other childhood diseases.*

All proceeds from today's event will support the Philadelphia Ronald McDonald House, and the families staying there who are caring for seriously ill children, AND Camp Can Do, a camp for children ages 8-17, who have been diagnosed with cancer in the last 5 years. They also offer a special session of Camp Can Do for siblings, kids ages 8-17, whose brother or sister has been diagnosed with cancer.
